

FLAG PROTOCOL

GUIDELINES FOR NETBALL AUSTRALIA & MEMBER ORGANISATIONS

This flag protocol documents the order in which national, State/Territory, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islands flags should be hung at a variety of netball events.

When flags are hung vertically in stadium, the top left component of the flag of a flag hung horizontally should stay in the top left, for instance the Union Jack. In the case of the Territory flags the top of Southern Cross will be on the top left with the ACT Coat of Arms or NT Desert Rose symbol will look 'upside down'.

3 Flags (General)

Australian flag, Aboriginal flag, Torres Strait Islands flag



4 Flags (Domestic Competitions)

Australian flag, State/Territory flag (example of ACT provided below), Aboriginal flag, Torres Strait Islands flag.



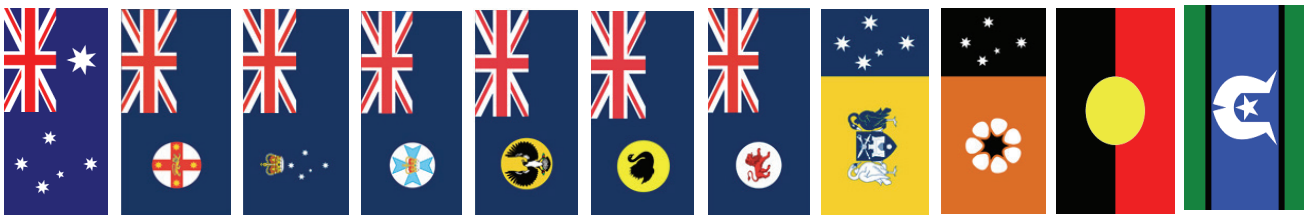
5 Flags (Australia v International Teams)

Australian flag, International team flag (ie. New Zealand), Aboriginal flag, Torres Strait Islands flag, IFNA flag.



11 Flags (National Championships)

Australian flag, NSW flag, Victorian flag, Queensland flag, South Australian flag, Western Australian flag, Tasmanian flag, ACT flag, Northern Territory flag, Aboriginal flag, Torres Strait Islands flag.
