PREVIEW

Open

The Gold Industry Group WA Netball League season is just around the corner and the big question leading into 2024 is can the Comets shoot for the stars and claim another premiership? Or will one of last year's finalists take the trophy for themselves? Or could there be a bolter from outside the top four?

We look at all eight teams to see what the key to the season will be.

FREMANTLE SHARKS

Last season's preliminary finalists want to be more versatile in 2024 in a hope that will allow them to challenge for the title.

The return of West Coast Fever training partner Ruth Aryang from a knee injury, combined with the recruitment of Georgie Cleaver and Ella Eastaugh has added speed, athleticism and experience to the Sharks unit. Add into the mix the experience of Jess Penny in defence and the Sharks are shaping as a formidable opponent in 2024.

HAMERSLEY COMETS

The reigning champions have lost key movers Sloan Burton and Jordan Cransberg however that has been offset with the recruit of Fever premiership player Emma Cosh and former Queensland Firebird Ash Unie.

The development of emerging talents such as Madeleine Ash, Jasmah Haywood and Clara Wigley could be the secret ingredient which see Michelle Cox's team challenge for a second premiership.

PEEL LIGHTNING

The Lightning have focused on fitness in the off-season in their quest to rise up the GIG WANL Open ladder.

While they have turned over half their squad from 2023, the additions of Rebecca Lill from Demons and former basketballer Kasey Meigel, combined with the familiarity of Belinda Lowe, Cherie Miller and Bec Nitschke, a rise up the ladder could be on the cards for the team from Mandurah.

RANGERS

The Rangers finished in fifth place in 2023 and if they continue to build on their connection which has been developing, finals in 2024 is a definite possibility.

Jill McIntosh Medallist Georgia Pitt will again be an important part in Rangers' campaign and lead a squad which has a good mix of experience and youth. Abbey Hicks will be important up front with Pitt while upgraded training partner and defender Heidi Wilson will be looking to build on her appearances in 2023.

SOUTHSIDE DEMONS

A familiar looking team is what the Demons will hope delivers success in 2024.

Like other teams, the Demons have been focusing on strength and conditioning in the off-season to provide that extra edge which could see them improve on their one-goal elimination final defeat to Sharks last season.

They welcome back Emily Hathaway, while the loss of leading goal scorer Kelsey McPhee (pregnant) will be a crucial spot the Demons need to fill in 2024.



SOUWEST JETS

The Souwest Jets have spent the offseason working on their communication and accountability as they look to improve on season 2023. If they can make their home venues in Eaton and Waroona their fortresses, improvement is a massive chance in 2024.

Finding cover for the loss of leading scorers Giselle Taylor and Marene Peyper will be important as the Jets look to climb up the ladder.

WEST COAST WARRIORS

The Warriors have also undergone a significant change to their list as they prepare for the 2024 season.

Coach Lorraine Ward has focused on bringing in young talent from across GIG WANL, headlined by last season's 20/U Grand Final MVP Jamaica Jauncey (Comets). The youngsters will be looking to the experienced players such as Kellie Baker, who has been at the pointy end of the past two Jill McIntosh medal counts, to lead the way in 2024.

WESTERN ROAR

The 2023 runners-up will look slightly different this season, however Coach Dylan McPherson has them focused on bringing their best netball to each and every game.

The retirements of Zoe Spencer and Bella McLernon and the loss of Georgie Cleaver to Sharks will provide opportunities for some of Roar's youngsters. While West Coast Fever Training Partners Zoe Cransberg and Emma Putt will bringing important skill and experience into the Roar environment.

After finishing the 2023 season on top, the team hopes to remain injury free this year, with a focus on maintaining strong connections through the court and keeping up their dominant pressure in defence.

Roar Men's will look very different this season, as new faces include Ian Brady from the Warriors, West Coast Fever Training Partner Dravyn Lee-Tauroa as well as newcomer Tom Harper.

The team, however, is suffering the loss of some big names, including Captain Dan Cools (retired), Australian representative Dylan McPherson, Kyle Hosking and Jordan Stothard with knee injuries, and Ben Cole with university commitments.

Coach Lynn Gay said their biggest challenge so far has been the loss of some of those big names, resulting in a shake up to their defensive side.

"Our biggest changes to the playing squad this season is our defensive end, basically losing our entire defence line to retirement and injuries, replacing them with a complete new line up," Gay said.

"In saying that it is going to be a very exciting new unit to watch grow and develop as a formidable team taking on new challenges each week.

"We will be looking at improving our

transition from defence to attack, being more patient in transition and maintaining possession by changing up the tempo of the game."

Gay said pre-season has had its ups and downs with injury concerns, but the players are working hard.

"Our defensive end has been working particularly hard in creating those new connections, which is very hard to make with all new players."

CELEBRATING NETBALL WA'S CENTENARY STATE LEAGUE TO GIG WANL

The West Australian Netball League, then known as the State Netball League, officially launched in 1989, ushering in a new era for netball in WA.

The League was established with six metropolitan and two country regions, consisting of a home and away series where all players and officials were required to play or compete in the region of their place of residence.

Fast forward to 2015, and following community consultation, the State Netball League was renamed the West Australian Netball League. The League now consisted of eight regions, including three from the country and five representing metropolitan areas. Residential boundaries were no longer a requirement and twenty-two teams played across three divisions: League, Reserves and 18 Under.

For a multitude of reasons, 2018 was an historic year for the League.

The Men's division was re-introduced with four teams, including the Perth Lions, Southeast Demons, Wheatbelt Flames and the West Coast Warriors, who later went on to win the premiership.

2018 also marked the WA Netball League's 30th anniversary, coinciding with a revamp to the competitions



format. Up to eight new clubs were sought out by Netball WA, with seven clubs awarded a license to compete in the 20 Under and Open divisions, four of those opting to submit a team into the newly invigorated Men's division.

In 2019, the league was re-branded to its current name, the Gold Industry Group West Australian Netball League (GIG WANL), following a \$5 million partnership with the Gold Industry Group and Netball WA.

The League as we know it today is very different than in the 1980s and 1990s, consisting of three divisions: Opens, Men's and 21 Under. The Men's division has grown to five teams in 2024, inspiring the next generation of boys to take a step onto the netball pathway and showcasing that netball is for everyone.

The growth and development of the League since its inception is a testament to Western Australia's commitment to netball and ensuring a pre-eminent competition for future elite athletes to hone their craft. Young players have continued to be fostered and trained within the League to be fantastic representatives of the state, many going on to play professionally and give back to the competition which gave them such a solid grounding.
