





NETBALL WA – GREAT SOUTHERN VOLUNTEER OF THE YEAR AWARD

Purpose

The purpose of the Volunteer of the Year Award is to recognise a volunteer member within the Netball WA (NWA) Great Southern regional area that has made a significant contribution to netball in a volunteer capacity over the designated 12-month period.

Selection Criteria

The candidate must meet the following criteria:

- Is a current registered financial Member of NWA.
- Made a sustained contribution over the 12-month period for Netball in the NWA Great Southern regional area.
- Contributes willingly and effectively in a way that makes a significant contribution to netball.
- Enhances the image of netball as a positive, dynamic, rewarding and achieving culture.
- Does not receive financial renumeration as an employee for their contribution.

Areas of Volunteer Service

Some examples of the nominees Volunteerism may include but are not be limited to:

- Specific initiatives or innovation which have had a significant impact on effecting positive change in netball.
- Position as a President, Committee Member, Board Director or similar.
- Position as an Administrator, Coach or Official.
- Contributed to training, education and development of others.
- Contributed to Netball WA Clubs, schools or community groups with active netball programs.
- Coached Club/Association/Regional teams and/or other programs and/or contributed to training, education and development of other coaches and players.
- Umpired and/or contribution to training, education and development of other umpires.
- Score Bench personnel and/or contributed to training, education and development of others.
- Volunteered as a Manager or in another role which has made a significant impact for the betterment of netball.









Selection Panel

The selection panel will consist of the following personnel:

- Netball WA Membership and Development Coordinator (Great Southern)
- Netball WA – Officials Coordinator (Great Southern)
- Department Local Government & Cultural Industries (DLGSC) Regional Manager (or other appropriate DLGSC staff member).

Supporting Information & Documentation

Nominations stating why a nominee should be considered for the Volunteer of the Year Award must include reasons and examples of the nominee's contribution.

Nomination and Selection Process

- Each NWA Member Affiliated Association or Club in the Great Southern regional area may nominate one (1) candidate for this award.
- Nominating Association/Club to complete all aspects of the nomination form Great Southern Volunteer of the Year Award
- Late nominations, or nominations not completed through the link will not be considered.
- Receipt of the nomination will be forwarded to the Association or Club.
- The Selection Panel will review all nominations received to ensure the nominations meet the criteria and send the recommendations to the NWA Stakeholder and Operations Manager for ratification.
- Selection process will be completed 1 month from application closing date.
- Upon ratification confirmation of the Volunteer of the Year Award will be forwarded to the Association or Club. The Association/Club is to keep the information confidential until the presentation has been made to the recipient.
- The announcement and formal presentation of the Volunteer of the Year Award will • be made at the Closing Ceremony of the Regional Championships or other suitable significant event. All nominees will be acknowledged at the presentation.

Recognition

In recognition of the awarding of the Volunteer of the Year Award, the recipient shall be:

- Provided with the Netball WA Volunteer of the Year Award;
- Provided with an appropriate gift and photo to commemorate the occasion. •
