

Tieralee has played at the Boorloo NAIDOC Carnival since she was a young girl, being able to see her artwork alongside her family and friends all across Western Australia means a great deal to her. The intent behind the design is to represent all First Nations players, the red symbolises those coming from the North, blue for the coastal mid-west players and Green for Booja land representing the Great Southern region.
