

Netball WA - Wheatbelt Goldfields

Aware Super Volunteer Award

Purpose

The purpose of the Aware Super Volunteer Award is to recognise a volunteer member within the Netball WA (NWA) Wheatbelt Goldfields (WBGF) regional area who has made a significant contribution to netball in a volunteer capacity for more than 12 months.

Service Period

Persons who have made a significant contribution for more than 12 months are eligible for nomination.

Selection Criteria

The candidate must meet the following criteria:

1. Is a current registered financial Member of NWA.
2. Made a sustained contribution for more than a 12-month period for Netball in the NWA Wheatbelt Goldfields regional area.
3. Contributes willingly and effectively in a way that makes a significant contribution to netball.
4. Enhances the image of netball as a positive, dynamic, rewarding and achieving culture.
5. Does not receive financial remuneration as an employee for their contribution.

Areas of Volunteer Service

Some examples of the nominees Volunteerism may include but are not limited to:

- Specific initiatives or innovation which have had a significant impact on effecting positive change in netball.
- Position as a President, Committee Member, Board Director or similar.
- Position as an Administrator, Coach or Official.
- Contributed to training, education and development of others.
- Contributed to NWA Clubs, schools or community groups with active netball programs.
- Coached Club/Association/Regional teams and/or other programs and/or contributed to training, education and development of other coaches and players.

- Umpired and/or contribution to training, education and development of other umpires.
- Score Bench personnel and/or contributed to training, education and development of others.
- Volunteered as a Manager or in another role which has made a significant impact for the betterment of netball.

Supporting Information & Documentation

Nominations stating why a nominee should be considered for the Volunteer Award must include reasons and examples of the nominee's contribution.

Nomination Process

- Each NWA Member Affiliated Association or Club in the Wheatbelt Goldfields regional area may nominate one (1) candidate for this award.
- Late nominations, or nominations not completed through the link will not be considered.
- Receipt of the nomination will be forwarded to the Association or Club Nominator.

Award Selection Panel

The selection panel will consist of, but not limited to, the following personnel, NWA WBGF Membership Coordinator, WBGF Development or Officials Coordinator and Department of Creative Industries, Tourism & Sport (DCITS) representative. In the event that any of the above members are unavailable NWA has the right to appoint another suitable representative to the selection panel.

Selection Process

- The Selection Panel will review all nominations received to ensure the nominations meet the criteria and send the recommendations to NWA Netball Stakeholder Manager for ratification.

- Selection process will be completed within 1 month from application closing date.
- Upon ratification, confirmation of the Volunteer Award will be forwarded to the Association or Club. The Association/Club is to keep the information confidential until the presentation has been made to the recipient.
- The announcement and formal presentation of the Volunteer Award will be made at the Closing Ceremony of the Regional Championships or other suitable significant event. All nominees will be acknowledged at the presentation.

The announcement and formal presentation of this Award will be made at the Closing Ceremony of the Regional Championships or other suitable significant event. All nominees will be acknowledged at the presentation.

NWA are not liable for any expenses associated with travel, accommodation or attendance of the recipient.

Recognition

In recognition of the awarding of the Volunteer Award, the recipient shall be:

- Provided with the NWA Volunteer Award;
- Provided with an appropriate gift and photo to commemorate the occasion.
