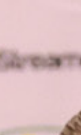

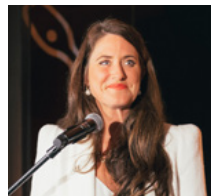

OPEN PREVIEW

The Gold Industry Group WA Netball League is shaped by renewed energy and elevated standards in 2026. Eyes will sharply be on Grand Finalists, the Comets and Western Roar to see who comes out of pre-season the strongest and who else on the ladder can fight their way into finals.

Comets

The Comets enter 2026 with confidence and cohesion after their premiership-winning 2025 campaign, carrying strong momentum and a renewed commitment to consistency. With the bulk of last season's championship team retained and key players returning from injury, Head Coach Michelle Cox emphasises building on established structures, elevating habits, and starting the season strongly.

Fremantle Sharks

The Sharks approach 2026 with a fresh look and an emphasis on versatility, strengthened by several interstate recruits who bring new depth to the squad. Head Coach Mel Rainey highlights connection building as a core off-season priority, particularly for players newly arrived in WA and away from traditional support networks. After falling short of expectations in 2025, the team is united in lifting standards, strengthening relationships, and driving competitiveness across every quarter as they position themselves as genuine contenders.

Peel Lightning

Peel Lightning enters 2026 energised by sweeping club-wide changes, including the introduction of a Men's team that has elevated training intensity. Head Coach Lisa McKenzie notes a revitalised environment supported by strong recruiting, giving the squad greater depth and flexibility across all lines. With clearer ambitions, the squad are targeting their first Open finals appearance.

Rangers

The Rangers' 2026 season is built on powerful cultural foundations and a deliberate effort to enhance connection, accountability, and training standards. Head Coach Taryn Barley emphasises consistent performance and the squad's commitment to elite behaviours. The Rangers aim to translate their depth and refined systems into a stronger step forward this season.

Southside Demons

The Demons enter 2026 with continuity, enabling them to refine existing systems rather than rebuild. Head Coach Josie Janz-Dawson notes that stability within the playing group has allowed deeper focus on fitness, game clarity, and maintaining performance standards across four quarters. With strong retention from 2025 and the exciting inclusion of Tierrah Miller, the Demons are well-positioned to convert their stability into a top-two push.





Souwest Jets

Souwest Jets' 2026 campaign centres on clarity of role, decision-making under fatigue, and building on the improvements made last season. The team retain a core group from 2025 whilst welcoming fresh energy through new contracted athletes and training partners. A key storyline for the Jets will be the development of their new mid court combinations, which have been a major focus throughout pre-season preparation.

West Coast Warriors

The Warriors prepare for 2026 with targeted recruitment and renewed emphasis on connection, working through structured blocks to sharpen skills and systems. Head Coach Lorraine Ward said the group aims to go further than last year by strengthening their mid court experience and leveraging the diverse strengths of their refreshed squad

Western Roar

Fuelled by unfinished business after their 2025 grand final loss, Western Roar approach 2026 with a blend of young talent and returning experience under new Open Head Coach Stu Dent. With several 21/U graduates stepping up despite limited squad time due to WCF commitments, Roar are determined to harness their fire, develop cohesion, and continue the club's legacy of sustained success.



COMETS

Fresh off a premiership-winning 2025 campaign, the Comets enter the 2026 season with clarity, confidence and a commitment to continual growth.

Head Coach Michelle Cox said the group has spent the pre-season continuing to build and strengthen their structures from last year, using their established foundations as the springboard for the season ahead.

Acknowledging their slower start to 2025, Cox emphasises that consistency is the number-one focus this year.

“We started slow in 2025, so our focus is to start strong and continue to build week on week,” she said.

The group is determined to carry their late-season momentum into the opening rounds of 2026.

Maintaining momentum after their premiership win won't be an issue for the Comets, Cox believing that the squad have embraced the challenge instead of fixating on outcomes.

“We had a great finish to 2025, and so for 2026 we are focused on the process, building the

habits, adding layers to our game plan, tweaking improvements, and the outcomes will follow,” she explained.

The Comets have retained the bulk of last year's championship team, and Cox believes that stability is a major asset.

“We have an amazing squad, and the players have a tremendous amount of respect and understanding of one another,” she says.

“We're in a really exciting position this year as we have some key players returning from injuries, their resilience and leadership are a massive boost to the group.

“In addition, we have athletes who have either been elevated from training partner roles in 2025 or joined us from 21/U and I am looking forward to seeing how their roles and responsibilities evolve throughout the season.

“We were extremely fortunate to maintain consistency from 2025 to 2026. It means we can build on last year without having to reset and relearn structures, and our experienced athletes can support those transitioning into the squad.”

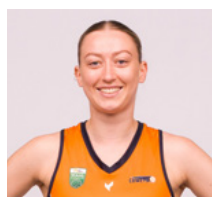

FREMANTLE SHARKS

Depth and versatility will drive the Open Sharks side into 2026, as they look to not just compete, but control key moments and own them this season.

Led once again by Mel Rainey, the side have focused on their connections and relationship building in the off season.

“We have a new-look team in 2026, with several players relocating from the east coast to WA,” Rainey said.

“Establishing strong relationships has been a priority, particularly as some of these athletes have limited family and support networks here, creating a connected, inclusive environment has been essential.”

After feeling they fell short of their expectations in 2025, the Sharks enter the new season determined to challenge more.

“We are continuing our pursuit of mental resilience

in critical moments, trusting each other, and holding ourselves accountable,” Rainey said.

“If we apply ourselves consistently and transfer our training standards to competition, we believe we are a genuine contender heading into finals,

“We’re building by raising internal standards and driving greater consistency across four quarters.”

The Sharks welcome back Fever Reserves premiership athletes Sophie Eastaugh, Jess Repacholi and Indiana Squiers, who continue to add experience and professionalism to the squad. They also welcome former WNBL athlete Shelby Britten whose addition to the mid court has been seamless.

Rainey said overall, it’s a balanced group with exciting emerging talent and experienced leaders.

“Our number one focus in 2026 is to challenge more, and that starts in our training environment,” she said.

PEEL LIGHTNING

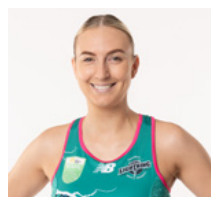

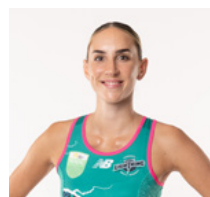

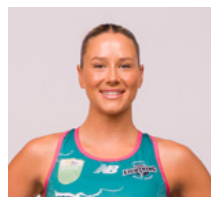

RANGERS

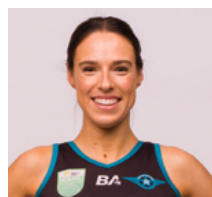

The Demons enter 2026 with rare continuity, enabling a pre-season focused on refinement rather than rebuild.

Head Coach Josie Janz-Dawson said they have been focusing on capitalising on continuity within the playing group, cementing their systems and structures.

“Our number one focus is playing a confident brand of netball that allows athletes to fully express their strengths,” she said.

“A big emphasis has also been placed on building a solid base level of fitness so we’re well prepared to withstand the demands of the season and maintain our standards across four quarters.”

The Demons hope to convert last year’s stability into top-two contention, especially after two years in the top four and just missing out on a grand final spot in 2025.

“Having established combinations and a clear game style means we can now focus on the finer details; those marginal gains are what separates teams at the pointy end,” Janz-Dawson said.

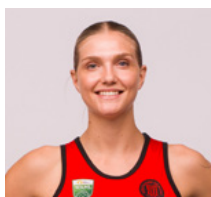
With a high level of retention from their 2025 squad, the stability, strength and balance of the list will be a force, especially with the inclusion of Tierrah Miller.

WESTERN ROAR

The Western Roar begin the new season fuelled by unfinished business.

Head Coach Stu Dent said that 2026 is a new year for the Team.

“2026 is a new year... the existing players from the 2025 GF are still pretty hurt, but that’s the joy of sport, there’s always another opportunity to learn, grow and use that hurt,” Dent said.

“There’s a fire in those athletes and they are looking forward to this upcoming season.”

Dent steps into the Open Head Coach role after years developing some of WA’s best young talent in the 21/U division.

“I really enjoyed my time with the 21/U program and seeing the best young athletes grow over the past few seasons,” he said.

“I have worked with a lot of the 2026 playing group, it’s been great to see how they have developed and now I get another opportunity to work with them.”

With new 21/U promotions and returning experience, early focus has been on alignment.

“We’ve been looking at getting this new group connected. We can’t expect it to gel and be seamless from the get-go,” he said,

“Even with the limited amount of time we get with our squad due to WCF program commitments, we are focused on ensuring we’re all on the same page as to our systems and strategies going into Round One.”

The squad don’t have one singular focus, instead acknowledging there may be many throughout the year.

Roar’s younger stars will get their chance to shine in 2026, many of whom have been knocking down the door in the 21/U program for years.

“It’s a credit to our club, that due to our program and coaches we can attract and retain the best young talent in the state,” he said.

“They’ve been training alongside our Open players for the past few seasons and all a part of either the WCF reserves or WCF 19s team.”

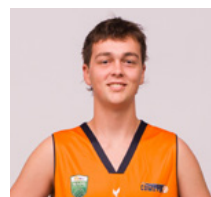

With a group that blends experience and youth, Gay believes they now have "a strong balance of athletes ready to step up and take ownership in a new environment."

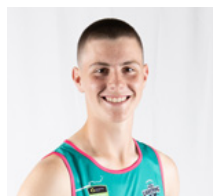
Young talents to watch include midcourter Harri Alleway, praised for his athleticism, and Prince George, whose presence in the shooting circle makes him a standout rising prospect.

The team is also energised by the league’s expansion, calling the arrival of Peel “a great sign of how quickly the men’s game is growing.”

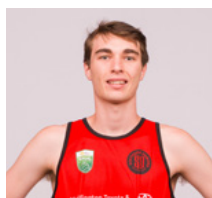

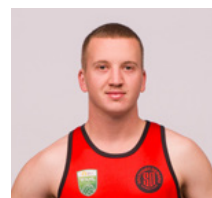

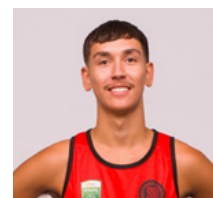

“There will be many threats coming through this team this year, what is unique is the elevation on Blayz Meredith entering as a TP to a contract as a Shooter!” Pehi said.

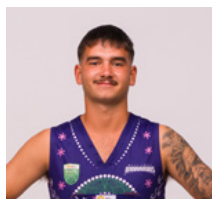

The squad boasts multiple athletes capable of influencing matches, making it difficult to pinpoint a single standout.

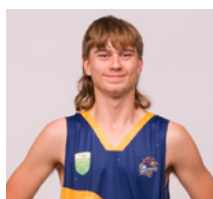

“Having Peel join the competition this year is a great development for our WANL competition and our sport generally,” she said.

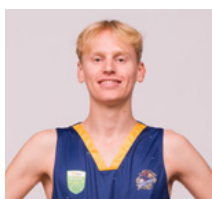

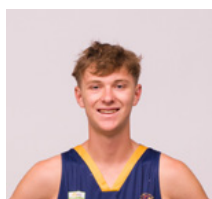
